We knew that when the Governor took away about a quarter of the race days at Philadelphia Park, and that the reduction would happen almost completely between Christmas and the end of February, the winter would be difficult for many here at the track. Some were able to collect unemployment, most had horses to continue to take care of, but without any income and the ability to pay wages. Everyone here loves horses so the workers continued to care for the horses of the trainers who could no longer pay them.

Without pay how could they eat? Fortunately with your help the Chaplaincy was able to see that no one went hungry. There was a lot of shopping to be done and it wasn't easy seeing that our pantry did not get empty.

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAPLAIN



The major difference between a Chaplaincy and a Congregation or Parish is that the Chaplaincy is ministry to a closed community. The communities that chaplains' minister in have varying levels of 'closed-ness', for instance a prison is much more closed from public access than a hospital.

The backstretch of the racetrack at Philadelphia Park is becoming more closed than it used to be. In fact, as you know, security is a growing issue in our world and the racetrack is not immune from this issue. Here at the racetrack there are some new rules to make sure benevolences can be delivered to the Chaplain and that the level of security necessary can be maintained. The bar codes that some have will cease to be used as of June 15, 2016.

In order for anyone to directly deliver food, clothing or any other item(s) to be donated to the Chaplain, racetrack security will have to receive specific approval to let the person through from "Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? ... "The King will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me.'. – Matthew 25:37-40 (NIV)

the Chaplain, each and every time. This means that the Chaplaincy will have to be notified (email, phone, etc.) ahead of time so that the Chaplain can then inform security that it is OK to let the person(s) through the gate.

If this does not happen ahead of time, and there will be times for reasons of emergency, the donated items may have to be left with security at the gate and they will transfer the items to the Chaplain at their earliest convenience. The track management has promised me that no one bringing donations to the Chaplain will be turned away.

These new rules only heighten the sense of and reality of the isolation that faces our backstretch workers. Please do not let them lessen your needful and valuable ministry to these who can rightly be called "the least of these brothers of" ours.
