It never ceases to amaze me how those with so little seem to have the greatest spirits of thankfulness. Is it because they have lived so close to the 'edge' for so long they are able to see the miraculous ways of God almost on a daily basis?

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MESSAGE FROM THE CHAPLAIN

A party of pioneers on the Oregon Trail suffered for weeks from a scarcity of water and grass for their animals. Most of the wagons had broken down, causing endless delays in the stifling heat. A feeling of fretfulness and futility prevailed. Optimism and cheer were gone. Courage was in limited supply.

One night the leaders called a meeting to air complaints. When they gathered around the campfire, one man stood up and said, "Before we commence our grief session, don't you think we should at least first thank God that he has brought us this far with no loss of life, with no serious trouble from the Indians, and that we have enough strength left to finish our journey?"

The other settlers agreed. After the brief prayer, all that could be heard were the cries of a distant pack of wolves. There was otherwise stone silence around the campfire, because no one had any grievances they felt were important enough to voice.

They suddenly realized if they couldn't be satisfied with what they'd received, they could at least be thankful for what they'd escaped. Thankfulness enabled them to see the mercies of God they had been overlooking.

Many of us have certainly had a difficult year – a year that we do not want to repeat – a year we would not wish on our worst enemy. And, yet, the Thanksgiving holiday is fast upon us. Charles Dickens said that we are somewhat mixed up here in America. He told an audience that instead of having one Thanksgiving Day each year we should have 364. "Use that one day just for complaining and griping," he said. "Use the other 364 days to thank God each day for the many blessings He has showered upon you."

Such calls to thankfulness, one might rightly say, are easy for a chaplain as greatly blessed as myself. Knowing this I am still compelled to call on you to exercise, to practice giving thanks, because the Bible directs us to do it, because so many studies show us of its benefits, and it is a necessary prerequisite to being happy.

I can't help but think of the many people who will

celebrate the first Thanksgiving since the death of a spouse, child, parent, or dear friend. It is so easy for me to simply write that one should give thanks for the time that they did have with the person(s) that have died.

What a raw Thanksgiving it will be for the parents who lost four daughters and four sons-in-law in that terrible limousine accident in upstate New York this fall. The Biblical patriarch Job lost all his children in one day - seven sons and three daughters. He lost all of his wealth as well.

The book of Job ends with his wealth restored and doubled what it had been. He once again has seven sons and three daughters. Why not twice as many children? I think this bespeaks of the truth that the children that Job 'lost' are 'lost' from his sight and touch for a time, but because they are humans their priceless souls live on forever, and the 'circle will not be broken'. They will be reunited in Heaven. God's provision for us never ends. God is good, worthy of thanks, because God is faithful, and God's lovingkindness endures forever. Thanks be to God – Amen!

Already this year we have given more than \$10,000.00 in direct benevolence to help individuals and families who were sick, out of work, or faced with unexpected expenses. We helped a family get an apartment by helping with their security deposit. Several times we have paid for car repairs. Many times we have paid for medicine without being asked, and the prescription would have gone unfilled without our help.

Several times this year we have paid for people who were homeless to stay in a hotel until we could find more permanent housing. These were times when both individuals and families would have otherwise been sleeping in a car or worse. Times when I was in a parking lot making phone calls on their behalf and concluding that they should let the chaplain pay for a hotel for them at least for tonight. It is such a joy to show them to the clean room where they can shower and have a nice big breakfast in the morning. The children can show up to school rested and clean the next morning.

It is such a joy to pray with people while sharing these benevolences. To talk about the love of Jesus with authority because they have so clearly witnessed the reality of this love in our sharing these helps with them and so often their families.

There is so much need. These things may seem like little in comparison. To the people that we are helping it is everything. It is not a little thing to them. It means so much to them. It is my pleasure to see this again and again. I know it is your pleasure to hear of this. May God continue to bless our chaplaincy that we can continue to minister in word and deed the Love of God.
